NOTICE OF SUSPENSION

This letter confirms the verbal notification provided to you on July 13, 2022, at approximately 6:15 p.m., by Dr. Jennifer Beasley-McKean, District Manager, that the Food Safety Inspection Service (FSIS) is suspending the assignment of inspectors related to the Slaughter Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point (HACCP) plan at Establishment 11466, West Texas Meats, Seagraves, Texas.

On Wednesday, July 13, 2022, at approximately 4:05 p.m., while performing humane handling verification, HAT category 8-Stunning Effectiveness, (b) (6) observed an egregious ineffective stunning of a hog. In the process of trying to render the hog unconscious, the establishment repeatedly stunned it four times; three stunning attempts being ineffective. The hog remained conscious and displayed rhythmic breathing and eye tracking during the stunning event. The animal was rendered unconscious on the fourth attempt by Mr. Matthew Campbell using the back up stunning device, a .243 rifle.

(b) (6) informed Mr. Campbell of the egregious noncompliance for ineffective stunning; a violation of Title 9 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 313.15(a)(1). The knock box was rejected with USDA Reject Tag B33267894. Two hogs were returned to their respective holding pens.

This egregious act does not meet the regulatory requirements of 9 CFR 313.15(a)(1) & (3) which state, (1) *The captive bolt stunners shall be applied to the livestock in accordance with this section so as to produce immediate unconsciousness in the animal before it is shackled, hoisted, thrown, cast, or cut. The animal shall be stunned in such a manner that they will be rendered unconscious with a minimum of excitement and discomfort...* (3) *Immediately after stunning, the animal shall be in a state of complete unconsciousness and remain in this condition throughout shackling, sticking and bleeding.*

Further, the actions taken clearly showed that your establishment failed to handle and/or slaughter animals humanely, as required in the Humane Methods of Slaughter Act of 1978, Title 7, Section 1902, which states in part, *all animals are rendered insensible to pain by a single blow or gunshot...*

This suspension action, without prior notification, is taken in accordance with the Rules of Practice, 9 CFR 500.3(b) which states, *FSIS also may impose a suspension without providing the establishment prior notification because the establishment is handling or slaughtering animals inhumanely.*

Your establishment does not have a robust systematic approach. FSIS is issuing a Notice of Suspension for this egregious inhumane handling event.

The suspension of the assignment of inspectors will remain in effect until such time as you provide adequate written assurance to this office of corrective actions and preventive measures to assure that the handling and/or slaughter of animals will be done humanely and in accordance with the Federal Meat Inspection Act (FMIA), 21 United States Code (USC) 610(b), and the regulations promulgated therein. You may submit your corrective and preventive actions to my attention at the Dallas District Office.

You are reminded that as an operator of a federally inspected establishment, you are expected to comply with FSIS regulations and to take appropriate corrective actions to prevent inhumane slaughter. Please be advised that your failure to respond adequately to these rules may result in our initiating action to withdraw inspection from your establishment.

In addition, you may request a hearing regarding this determination pursuant to FSIS's Rules of Practice, 9 CFR 500. The Rules of Practice were published in the Federal Register, Volume 64, Number 228, on November 29, 1999. As specified in Section 500.5(d), should you request a hearing, FSIS will file a complaint that will include a request for an expedited hearing.
